FUN FACTS

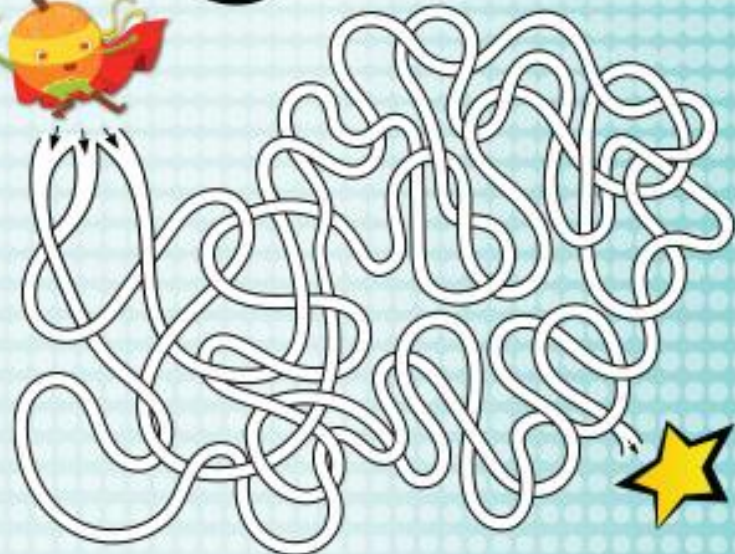
